And now for something completely different.

(And it is not "The Larch")
(or a Norwegian Blue)
(or the velocity of an unladen swallow)
Sorry!

It was mentioned briefly during one of those post-activity refreshment sessions well known to U3A Dénia members. Which Group it was is irrelevant, but some adroit member simply said: "What you did earlier looked just like how some other members of the U3A XXXXX group do"

And it all became clear. And U3A Dénia Group Fusion was born.

With over 20 Groups to have a go at, particularly with those usual diary clashes, it has been suggested that we combine two or more complementary activities.

Imagine.....

Chess with Music – played by Queen, or The Move, or Chubby Checker. Art with Petanque – excellent grouping, and the flash of balls glistening in the sunlight

Photography and Fishing – your grouping is out of plaice, he is a dab-hand of reeling in, look at that beautiful mackerel sky.

The combinations are infinite (well, not infinite but about 22! for you mathematicians).

So, where is all of this drivel going? It heads towards Racketball and the newlyformed Salsa sessions.

At this point I request that any reader still with me, and interested, should click on to the link here – www.youtube.com/watch?v=PfDVnX4j3-w (According to my laptop you need to hold down "ctrl" and click with the mousey thing).

I ask you to examine minutely two of the Salsa moves: the "Basic Step 1" and the "Right Turn on 1".

Those in the know who play Racketball and Squash will see the similarities. The first is the basic move when you stand on the "T", the best position defend in the middle of the court where you can move quickly in any direction.

"Basic Step 1" is the usual manoeuvre for going forward towards the front wall to hit a short ball, and then return to the "T". You should practice this at every opportunity, ideally to the accompaniment of a mid-beat Salsa rhythm. It could be at home, (for example, when drying the dishes), or in a Supermarket check-out queue. In the latter you might also attract attention from a fine specimen of the opposite sex as the move is also known as "el apasionado de Cuba"!

The "Right turn on 1" is normally only used for semi-professional players where a more complicated game is in play. It begins with the "Basic Step 1" moving forward, but then becomes the Right Turn when the opponent, instead of playing a short ball, then flicks it up and towards the back corner. At this point the receiver will say something like "Ooops!", turn to the right on the beat of 3, and attempt to play the ball from a far more difficult situation. DO NOT ATTEMPT TO PRACTICE THIS ONE in either your kitchen or Supermarket. More space is required. You could try the garden, but ask your neighbours first.

Of course, only the very experienced should attempt the "Left Turn on 1", but it is a particularly nifty manoeuvre in Pubs when turning away from the Bar with a full drinks tray.
