January Members Meeting:

The members were treated to a talk on Meditation from The Venerable Lama Rinchen Gyaltsen from the Buddist restreat on La Sella, Pedreguer.



Lama Rinchen Gyaltsen was born in 1972 in Uruguay from Spanish parents. He received his formal education in the United States, where he graduated in Psychology and Arts in Rutgers University. His interest in meditation made him take courses on Buddhism, and the depth and pragmatism of the teachings definitely caught his interest. He started studying with Khenpo Pema Wangdak in New York in 1993, and in 2003 he finished a 3-year theoretical and practical training program of the Pema Ts'al school designed by Khenpo Pema.

After this, he started his journey through Asia. His Eminence Chogye Trichen Rinpoche, one of the most renowned masters in Tibetan Buddhism, ordained him as a monk in Lumbini, the birthplace of the Buddha, and gave him the Tibetan name of Ngawang Lekshe Rinchen Gyaltsen (Power of the Verb, Proverb, Jewel, Emblem).

Lama Rinchen Gyaltsen teaches Buddhist philosophy and the practice of meditation in Spain, and also gives courses in a sporadic fashion in the United States, Europe and South America. For the people who cannot attend the in-person courses because of the distance or lack of resources, Lama Rinchen founded Instituto Paramita, an important platform of online teachings, in which a great deal of the fundamental teachings of Sakya Tibetan Buddhism are provided for free.


