With low cloud down to 300 m, the walk to the 700 m summit of El Cau was regretfully cancelled.

Previous walks took place in our usual sunny weather with excellent, far-reaching vistas on crisp days. On the 7th January a "bit easier than usual" walk brought out 24 people to do the circular route of the corals, from Xeresa. This passes a number of ruined corals with living accommodation, where large mixed flocks of sheep and goats would have been kept. The walk was without incident except for a high gate across our path being locked.



Arms, legs and knees were further exercised in climbing the fence but were soon compensated with a rest and a beer in Xeresa.



The following walk on the 21st January was rather more strenuous and 9 turned up to do the ascent of Monte Ponoig. This mountain, situated just behind Puig Campaña, is 1140m high and gives glorious 360 degree views.



The 4th February had 13 of us doing a circular walk from Tarbena. Although it was a brilliant day we still encountered large snow patches.

The next walk on the 4th March will be the cancelled walk, a figure of eight over El Cau, starting from the road from Jalon to Benissa.
