**Changes to the Postal Service

The Spanish postal service Correos is making changes to the service it provides to areas that consist of low density housing; that is to say, residential areas outside of the urban nucleus of towns and cities. These changes will be implemented from October 2018. This is happening nationally and the council for each village, town and city will have to decide what action, if any, they wish to take to mitigate the situation for their citizens.

For those living within Dénia the latest information we have is as follows:If you live within the main urban area your postal service will not be affected.
(there is no map yet available to define the boundary but we can speculate that this means the area inside the following streets/places:- Joan Fuster, Torrecremada, McDonalds, Miguel Hernandez)

Those living in urbanisations outside of this perimeter who have a bank of postboxes (buzones) will continue to receive deliveries but you should check with your administrator that the arrangement and numbering of these buzones complies with the requirements of Correos.

Those living in individual houses or villas outside of the urban nucleus with their own postboxes will lose their postal service from October 2018. In response to this Dénia Council has decided to construct 12 banks of postboxes geographically distributed around it's area. Within the next few weeks residents should receive a letter from Denia Council informing them:-

Of the location of these postboxes

How residents can purchase one (it will be a one-off cost not a rent)

The cost

The period of time within which residents should decide whether or not to purchase one

The specific information which will need to be added to their postal addresses Residents who do not wish to use this service will need to rent their own P.O.Box Associations like the U3A will receive further details from Denia Council when it is available and this will be circulated to members.
