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January 15th 2019 Lion King Musical, Madrid with overnight stay:

The weather was perfect, given the time of year, and we had sunshine and 15 degrees on all three days, although the temperature dropped like a stone at night.

Our hotel was just a ten minute stroll from Plaza Mayor - which was still sporting a giant sparkling silver Christmas tree - and all the tapas bars and restaurants that make Madrid a gourmet's paradise.



Just outside the Plaza is San Miguel, a covered market that now houses a number of bodegas selling delicious wine by the glass and countless stalls offering a mouthwatering selection of unusual tapas and seafood delicacies - not an albondigas or patatas bravas in sight! I could have stayed all evening here but seats were hard to come by, so it was just one tapa and move on elsewhere.

We spent our first free day individually on various pursuits from visiting the house of the famous painter Joaquin Sorolla, a guided walk of lesser known places of historical interest, a hop on hop off bus ride or just strolling around and getting a feel for this wonderful city.

In the evening, half of us were royally entertained with a theatre trip to see The Lion King. Breathless comments afterwards ranged from 'utterly superb,' 'better than fabulous,' 'wonderful costumes and dancing' and 'gorgeous music.'

There was still time next morning for more sightseeing or shopping before we left at 2pm and arrived back in Dénia before eight, having had a really enjoyable experience.

Javea Players are performing the Lerner & Loewes' My Fair Lady at the Union Musical, Gata They have offered to reserve a block of seats for U3A Dénia on Friday 29th March.

We have therefore negotiated a price for coach transport from Dénia/Ondara for those who no longer like driving at night.

The price for return coach and the show is €24 per person

The show starts at 7.30pm - there is a 20 minute interval during which time reasonably priced drinks will be on sale. The show then ends at 22.30 - the coach will be available at 22.40 for the return journey.

We do hope that you will find this of interest - we do need to get at least 35 people travelling by coach to make this viable. The block of seats will be reserved until 3rd February so please book your places before that date.

14th June – A visit to Guadalest

In the morning we will visit Guadalest. Situated on a mountain overlooking the valley of the river Guadalest, the town is surrounded by the mountain chains of Sierra d'Aixorta, Sierra de Serella and Sierra de Aitana. The way there leads through pine forests, citrusgroves, nispera and almond trees the sight of which makes for a very pleasant journey.



Then take your own picnic lunch for an afternoon at **Algar Falls** picnic area followed by a walk around the falls –



- **April:** Elvis Fiesta at Benidorm Palace with overnight stay in a nearby hotel.
- **May:** Caravaca de la Cruz Running of the horses Thursday 2nd May.
- Sept: Sunset Cruise fundraiser
- **October:** Xativa and Gandia dotty train to do a tour of Xativa passing the Borja house. Then a meal at lunchtime in a local restaurant. Then rejoin the coach and visit Gandia and the Borja Palace.
- **Dec:** Christmas possibly Benalmádena with visits to the White Village, Caves, Malaga lights and Mijas. Other venues are also being considered.
