- In Codenames, two teams compete to see who can make contact with all of their agents first. Spymasters give one-word clues that can point to multiple words on the board
- Their teammates try to guess words of the right colour while avoiding those that belong to the opposing team.
- If the teammates interpret the clues correctly, they rescue their own agents.
- If they guess wrong, they may rescue enemy agents (helping the other team), or may even reveal the assassin (causing them to immediately lose the game).
